

Weblog (blog) submission guidelines

This is intended to provide general guidelines and an outline of our policies, for members submitting content to our weblog.

The blog module allows selected parties to maintain an online blog or diary. This blog is intended to provide a novel and interesting experience for the writer and reader, as it is intended that this blog be used to detail the developments and growth of start-up businesses run by the writer.

It provides easy-to-write and easy-to-read online diaries or journals that can be filled with daily thoughts, poetry, boneless blabber, spiritual theories, intimate details, valuable experiences, cynical rants, semi-coherent comments, writing experiments, artistic babblings, critics on current facts, fresh insights, diverse dreams, chronicles and mumbling madness available for public consumption. All in the name of starting a business! It is an avenue for the writer to describe and help other members of the community with a real-life experience of starting a business, and may feed as an avenue for discussions on issues faced, within the forum. It may also form a good means of advertising for the said business! It also provides readers with an experience of the issues and feeling of starting a business, for them to learn from the ups and downs and generally share in the experience of growing a business.

It is generally encouraged for the writer to speak his/her mind, and to detail anything that may be interesting or that may be causing difficulties in the writer's business. A few pointers on the content contributed, however:

1. The content should never slander another business or company's activities; we are here to learn from your own business, not to hear negative comments on other people's businesses. Writings about difficulties faced in your own business is acceptable, however outright slander and negative criticisms of the other business is discouraged.
2. Any names mentioned, persons or companies (including your own business name), should be changed to false names. This is to provide anonymity and avoid unnecessary publicity or the possibility of libel suits from other parties. However, with your consent, interested parties who wish to deal with you and your company may approach us at BusinessVenturing.com, and we will endeavour to provide establish a contact between you and these parties.
3. You are generally free to write what you feel like writing (with the exception of the items we mentioned above), however we would ask that you write on your businesses and thoughts involved in business activity, and not on a random un-associated topic.
4. All copyright and policies applicable on BusinessVenturing.com and its forums also apply to this weblog, and we reserve the right to edit the content should it be necessary. We do not expect to have to do this, however, and would like to allow a free hand at your own writings.
